OVERTIME

SUBSTITUTIONS

Substitutions may be made, with the consent of the referee, at any stoppage of play.

MULTIPLE ROSTERING

Student-athletes are only permitted to be rostered on ONE team the duration of the season.

GRADE LEVEL ASSIGNMENT

Student-athletes are encouraged to compete at their current grade level. In certain situations a player, based on their skill level and/or their size, may "play up" with the next higher grade division. This decision is at the discretion of the athletic director at his/her school. **IT IS NEVER** permitted for a student-athlete to compete in a lower grade division.

PLAYING TIME

Coaches are encouraged to allow each team member to play in half of each match. This **IS NOT** an enforced rule, but is in the best interest of the developing athlete.

HEADING

Heading is **ONLY** permitted in the Middle School Division. These players are permitted to head the ball in any match or competition. These student-athletes may practice heading the ball in an organized team practice or skill session, but coaches shall monitor this practice so that no single player heads the ball more than 25 times per week, regardless of setting.

Players in the lower grade divisions shall not head the ball directly from the air in any match or competition, nor shall these players practice heading the ball in any organized team setting. If a player in the lower grade divisions deliberately heads the ball in a match, the referee shall award an indirect free kick to the opposing team at the spot of the infraction. If the heading occurs within the penalty area, the referee shall move the ball outside the penalty area and award an indirect free kick to the opposing team.

SUSPICION OF HEAD INJURY

In the event of a head injury during a match or competition, the coach must immediately remove the student-athlete from the match. The player may not return to compete until cleared by a medical professional.

CODE OF CONDUCT

All coaches, players, and parent spectators are required to show respect for the game, for the equipment, for the opposition and their fans, and for the game officials. It is the responsibility of the head coach to ensure that all his/her assistant coaches, players, and parent spectators are behaving in an appropriate manner before, during, and at the conclusion each match. Any coach, player, or parent spectator found by a game official or league representative to be in violation, will receive the following:

1st offense - verbal and/or written warning

2nd offense - one game suspension

3rd offense - removal from the league

Junior Premier Sports reserves the right to immediately escalate the penalty in the event of behavior warranting a greater penalty. This decision will be at the discretion of Junior Premier Sports, with input from each of the schools represented in the league.
